

Big Cypress National Preserve - Turner River Canoe Trip (Morning)

Date: **Friday**, January 15, 2010

Focus: **Specialty/Canoeing** – This field trip will focus on the activity, incorporating education on the wildlife, habitat and ecology of the area visited and is NOT primarily a birding field trip.

Field Trip Description: Paddle the Turner River past towering cypress, through mangrove tunnels and across sawgrass prairies to view some of South Florida's most spectacular scenery and wildlife. Canoes, paddles, and life vests provided. **Basic canoeing experience is required. You must also be able to swim.**

Maximum Group Size: 12

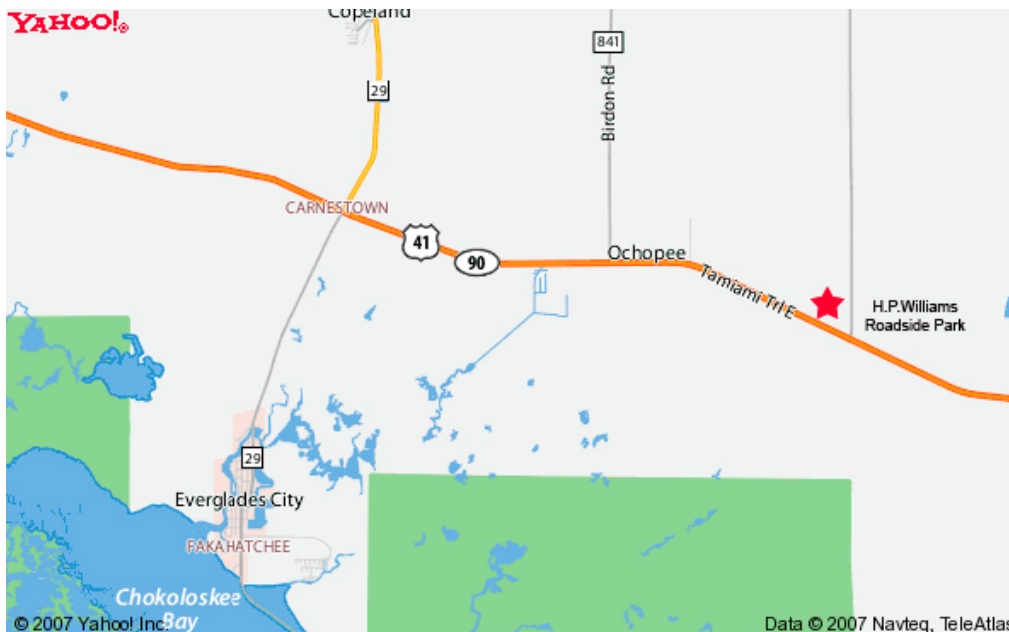
Time Begin: 10:00 am

Time End: 2:00 pm

Where to Meet: meet at **10:00 am** at the **Turner River Canoe Launch** (Big Cypress NP)

Directions to Meeting Place: The canoe launch is located on the north side of US 41 (Tamiami Trail) in the Big Cypress National Preserve, approximately **35 miles SE of Naples**. You will pass HWY 29, Wootens Airboats and Big Cypress HQ on the way. The launch is a small parking lot just west of H.P Williams Roadside Park. Signs are posted.
