She has traveled throughout the United States working in various wildlife-related activities, including monitoring sea turtles off the South Carolina coast, leading kayaking tours through Francis Beidler Forest, radio tagging and tracking prairie grouse in Oklahoma, and helicopter monitoring of nesting swallow-tailed kites in Georgia. One of her many internships was at the Conservancy's Wildlife Rehabilitation Center where she developed her love of wildlife rehabilitation. She has been a Conservancy of SWFL staff member since 2004 assisting over 2,500 animals a year.
